But we need to ask why would all four gospel writers include these unexplainable events? Could it be our attempts to shape God into our understanding of how things work, or how things are possible is really just an imposition of our own limits on God?



There are approximately 89 congregations in the Grand Canyon Synod, including new mission starts. The territory of this synod is the State of Arizona; the counties of Clark, Esmeralda, Lincoln, and Nye in the State of Nevada; and New Promise Lutheran Church, in St. George, Utah.

On Saturday, June 12, 2021, Pastors Steve and Nanette, Elizabeth Danielson, Denise Haala, Barb Hummel, Jeff Michaels, and Dan Wilke participated among the 292 voting members, conducting by Zoom the Grand Canyon Synod Assembly. Like congregations required to hold an annual meeting, the Grand Canyon Synod is required to hold an annual assembly of voting members from every congregation within the synod. Barbara Carl, Holy Trinity, Chandler, AZ was elected as our new Vice-President. Other elections brought new members to the Synod Council, voting members to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in August 2022. Greetings, a bible study, and the worship sermon were provided by the Rev. Dr. Al Starr from the Churchwide organization. A video greeting was provided by our Presiding Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton. Various milestones, anniversaries and remembrances of congregations that have closed and rostered ministers who have died, were acknowledged. A mission spending plan of over \$1.8 million was approved for February 1, 2022-January 31, 2023. 50% of all unrestricted income provided by congregations of the synod are passed on to support the global and national work of the ELCA. A new Synod Capital Campaign "Growing Generosity: Planting Seeds for a New Generation" was launched with a goal of \$500,000 to be raised by 12/31/23. The three foci for the campaign are: Planting seeds of financial support for pastors and congregations through an Educate, Equip, and Enact Lilly Grant match of \$150,000; Planting seeds for Lutheran Campus Ministry (ASU, UA, NAU, University of Nevada at Las Vegas), and new and emerging ministries within the synod; Planting seeds for Lutheran Advocacy Ministry of Arizona and Lutheran Engagement and Advocacy of Nevada with a focus on childhood hunger and needs of vulnerable elderly. \$281,656 has already been given or pledged from congregations and individuals! Small group breakouts took place to discuss with others around the synod new relevant issues facing our congregations since going through the pandemic, and what new ministry collaboration or connection has developed because of doing ministry through the pandemic.

The theme "Freed in Christ" was based on Galatians 5:13-14:

*"For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. <sup>14</sup>For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."*

- Coordinate delivery with LSS at Victory Lutheran for end of July or early August.




Naomi Circle will meet on Monday, July 12 at 1:00 by Zoom. This lesson continues our threepart Summer 2021.

Nanette included the book, <u>American Dirt</u> by Jeanie Cummins in her sermon on June 6th. The next Book Club date will be scheduled for **Sunday**, **August 8th** to discuss the book <u>American Dirt</u>. We will meet in Fellowship Hall soon after **the 9:00 service**. I invite everyone who is interested to join us, men as well as women. Here is a synopsis of the book:

Lydia Quixano Pérez lives in the Mexican city of Acapulco. She runs a bookstore. She has a son, Luca, the love of her life, and a wonderful husband who is a journalist. And while there are cracks beginning to show in Acapulco because of the drug cartels, her life is, by and large, fairly comfortable.

Even though she knows they'll never sell, Lydia stocks some of her all-time favorite books in her store. And then one day a man enters the shop to browse and comes up to the register with a few books he would like to buy—two of them her favorites. Javier is erudite. He is charming. And, unbeknownst to Lydia, he is the *jefe* of the newest drug cartel that has gruesomely taken over the city. When Lydia's husband's tell-all profile of Javier is published, none of their lives will ever be the same.

Forced to flee, Lydia and eight-year-old Luca soon find themselves miles and worlds away from their comfortable middle-class existence. Instantly transformed into migrants, Lydia and Luca ride *la bestia*—trains that make their way north toward the United States, which is the only place Javier's reach doesn't extend. As they join the countless people trying to reach *el norte*, Lydia soon sees that everyone is running from something. But what exactly are they running to?

*American Dirt* will leave readers utterly changed. It is a literary achievement filled with poignancy, drama, and humanity on every page. It is one of the most important books for our times.

Already being hailed as "a *Grapes of Wrath* for our times" and "a new American classic," Jeanine Cummins' *American Dirt* is a rare exploration into the inner hearts of people willing to sacrifice everything for a glimmer of hope.

I have already started to read this book and highly recommend it to everyone. It starts off with a real bang that makes it hard to put down. Hopefully, you will read this book and join us on August 8th.

#### IT'S ABOUT TIME!



Pastor Nanette's Sermon Title is "What do you fear more... Miracles or Change?"

## <u>Job 38:1-11</u>

Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind:

- <sup>2</sup> Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?
- <sup>3</sup> Gird up your loins like a man,
- I will question you, and you shall declare to me.
- <sup>4</sup> Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding.
- <sup>5</sup> Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?
- <sup>6</sup> On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone
- <sup>7</sup> when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?
- <sup>8</sup> 'Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb?—
- <sup>9</sup> when I made the clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band,
- <sup>10</sup> and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors,
- <sup>11</sup> and said, "Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped"?

# <u>2 Cor. 6:1-13</u>

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. <sup>2</sup>For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you,

and on a day of salvation I have helped you.'

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! <sup>3</sup>We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, <sup>4</sup>but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, <sup>5</sup>beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; <sup>6</sup>by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, <sup>7</sup>truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; <sup>8</sup>in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; <sup>9</sup>as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; <sup>10</sup>as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. <sup>11</sup>We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. <sup>12</sup>There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. <sup>13</sup>In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.

## <u>Mark 4:35-41</u>

<sup>35</sup> On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' <sup>36</sup>And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. <sup>37</sup>A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. <sup>38</sup>But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' <sup>39</sup>He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. <sup>40</sup>He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' <sup>41</sup>And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'
